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COVID-19 ANGUILLA RESPONSE UPDATE AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Hon Parliamentary Secretary and Economic Development and Special Ministerial Assistant to the Hon Minister for Social Development/Education remained.

Executive Council convened on Sunday 12 July to consider matters relating to the globally evolving COVID-19 situation.

Council:

- (i) noted that there are no active or suspected cases of COVID-19 in Anguilla, and encouraged residents of Anguilla to continue to practice social distancing and good basic hygiene to prevent the spread of all infectious diseases;
- (ii) noted that based on the current epidemiological situation regionally and globally, the borders will remain closed for passenger movements until 30 July except for:
 - (a) medical emergencies and evacuations with the approval of the Chief Medical Officer; and
 - (b) persons wishing to leave Anguilla on flights/boats to approved destinations.
- (iii) further noted that to date almost two hundred (200) persons have been repatriated without incident; and
- (iv) agreed that based on the evolving situation repatriations from areas with prevalence rates over 0.2% should be paused for 14 days starting immediately (12 July) until 25 July in the first instance. Further agreed that a decision on the resumption of the programme should be made on the epidemiological situation locally, regionally and internationally.
