



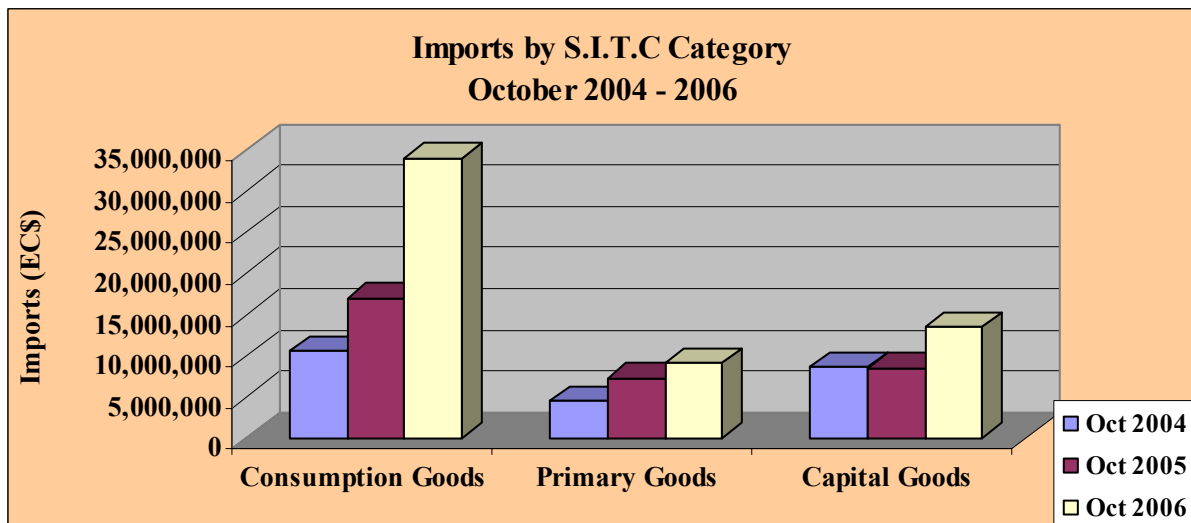
Anguilla: International Merchandise Trade Statistics Summary October 2006

OVERVIEW

Imports for the month of October totalled EC\$58.5 million, a 78.4% increase over the corresponding 2005 October value. This increase was fuelled by Consumption Goods which accounted for 60.4% of total imports in October 2006. Total imports for the year were EC\$387.7 million up to the end of October 2006, a 38.9% increase over the October 2005 corresponding figure.

There were increases in imports for all the S.I.T.C¹ categories during October 2006, with Consumption Goods experiencing the greatest increase of 107.7%, almost doubling its 2005 October figure. Primary and Capital Goods both showed an increase of 26.7% and 64.1% respectively.

Primary and Capital Goods contributed 15.8% and 23.8% respectively to the total import bill for October 2006.



CONSUMPTION GOODS

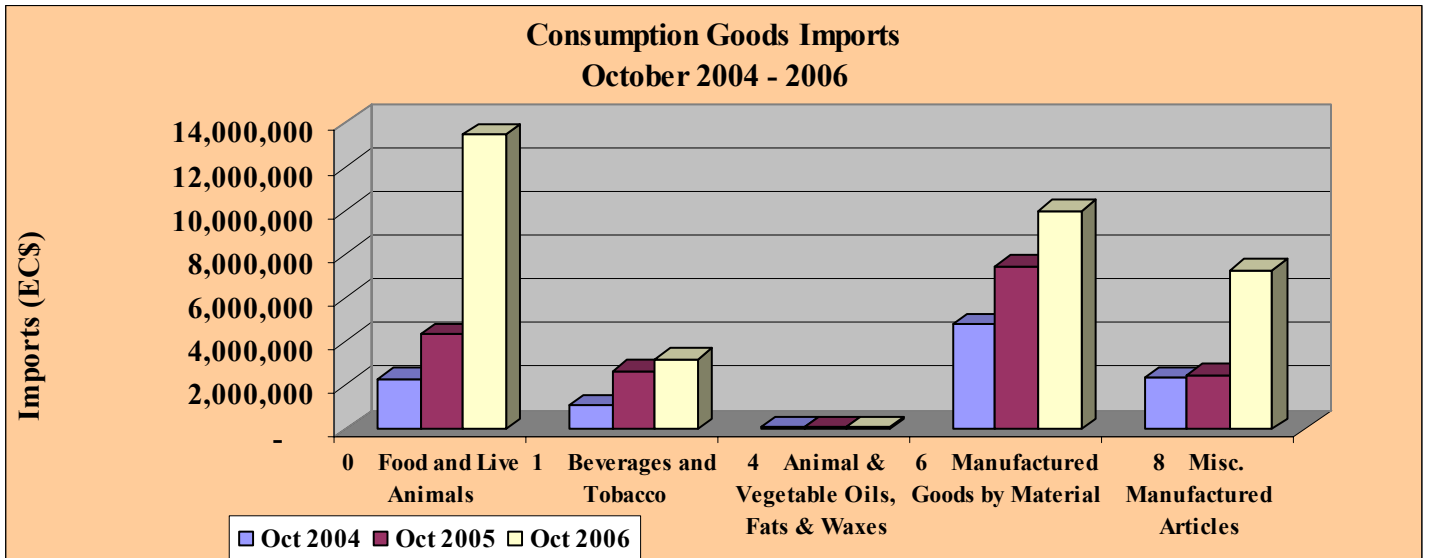
Consumption Goods accounted for EC\$35.3 million of the total imports, with all the groups except for Animal & Vegetable oils, Fats & Waxes showing increases over their corresponding October 2005 figures.

The Food and Live Animals component contribution largest value to the Consumption Goods category, with a total value of EC\$13.5 million. This value accounted for 38.1% of Consumption Goods imports, which have a 211.2% increase over its 2005 corresponding figure. It should be noted that some portion this increase is in part due to imports of sugar for re-export.

Manufactured Goods classified chiefly by Materials was the second largest contributor to this category, accounting for EC\$10.0 million, a 28.7% of the Consumption Goods imports. This was an increase of 33.3% over its corresponding October 2005 corresponding figure.

Miscellaneous Manufactured Articles for the month of October 2006 experienced the largest increase over its 2005 corresponding figure by 238.8%, which accounted for EC\$8.4 million of the total value of Consumption Goods for October 2006. This was 23.9% of the Consumption Goods imports value.

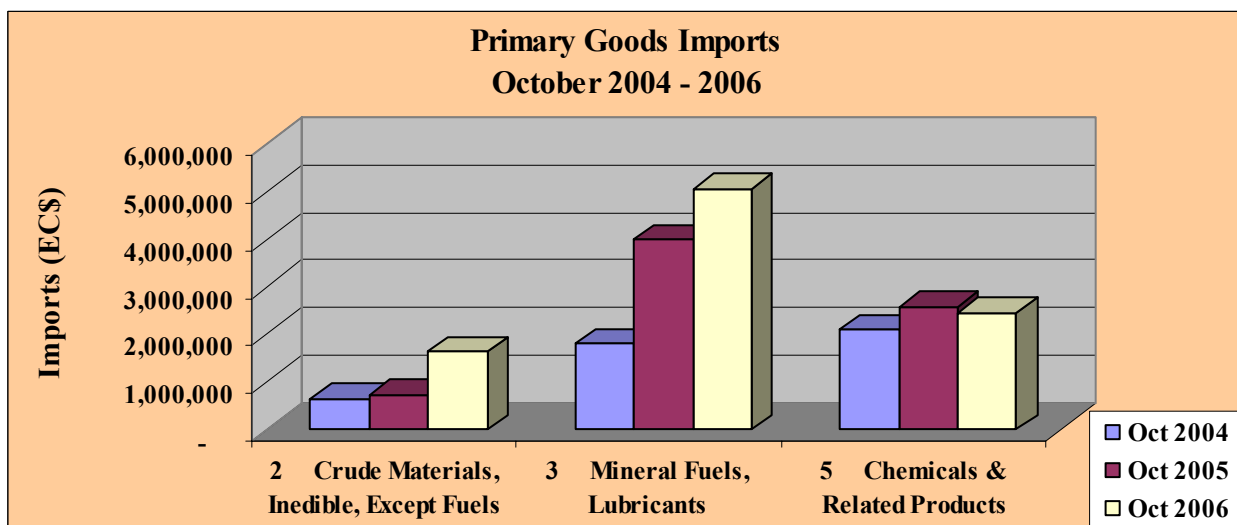


PRIMARY GOODS

Primary Goods accounted for EC\$9.2 million of the total imports, a 26.7% increase over its 2005 figure. Mineral Fuels and Lubricants fuelled this increase and accounted for 54.7% of Primary Goods imports' value, which showed an increase of 26.4% over its October 2005 figure.

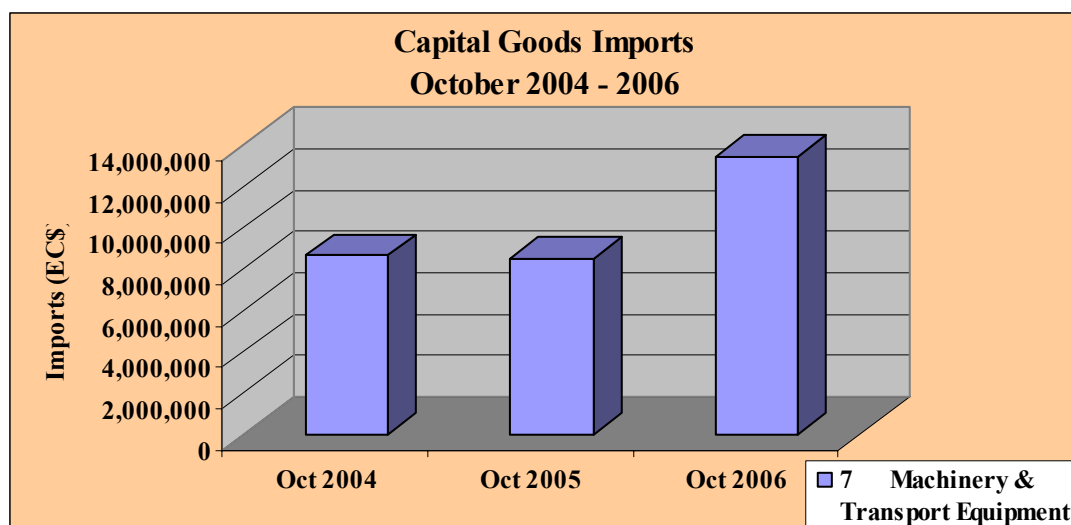
Crude Materials, Inedible, Except Fuels in this category also showed an increase. Crude Materials, Inedible, Except Fuels have accounted for EC\$1.7 million which have more than double its 2005 October value with a 139.1% increase. This category was mainly fuelled mainly by an increase in imports of sand & non-coniferous wood used in the construction works.

Chemicals & Related Products contributed EC\$2.4 Million, 26.5% of Primary Goods. However, this component experienced a decline of 4.6% over its corresponding October 2005 figure.



CAPITAL GOODS

Capital Goods accounted for EC\$13.9 million, 23.8% of the total import bill, with Machinery and Transport Equipment being the sole component in this category experiencing a 64.1% increase over its corresponding October 2005 figure.



EXPORTS

Exports which include re-exports and domestic exports for the month of October were EC\$13.8 million, a 990.3% increase over its October 2005 value. Domestic export totaled EC\$13.7 million in October 2006 as compared to EC\$.9 million in October 2005, a 1503.9% Increase.

Anguilla's balance of trade for October 2006 was in deficit by EC\$44.7 million, a deficit increase by 41.8% when compared with the same period in 2005.
