EX MEMO 25/21 Applications for the Permit of Permanent Residence

Hon. Parliamentary Secretary, Head of Governor's Office and Financial Adviser remained.

The Honourable Minister of Home Affairs briefed Council on the memorandum. It was noted that Executive Council Minute 23/342 instructed the Ministry of Home Affairs to liaise with the Attorney General's Chambers to draft Regulations in line with Section 24 of the Immigration Act as it relates to the grant of Permanent Residency. It was further noted that many efforts were made to execute this directive, however, it was decided that the Executive Council will resume considering the endorsement of the Minister's recommendations for Permits for Permanent Residency to Her Excellency the Governor in the interim of the revised Immigration Act taking effect. As such, it is recommended that the Executive Council endorse the Minister's recommendation for grating of a Permit of Permanent Residency to Her Excellency the Governor for 22 persons.

Executive Council:

- Endorsed the recommendation of the Honourable Minister of Home Affairs with responsibility for Immigration, for submission of applications for consideration by Her Excellency the Governor, as it relates to the grant of Permanent Residence in accordance with Section 24 of the Immigration and Passport Act 2000, for 22 persons;
- 2. Further agreed that the applicant must submit a valid Certificate of Good Standing from the Inland Revenue Department, before the application is submitted to Her Excellency the Governor for consideration; and

3. Noted that granting of Permanent Residence does not exempt the recipients from the provisions of the Labour Relations Act, 2018 and associated Work Permit Regulations 2023 nor will it entitle them to Belonger status until they have been residing in Anguilla for 15 years, or become a naturalized British Citizen in Anguilla. These individuals would become eligible for applying for Naturalization after one year of permanent residency being issued.

- (c) The Licencees must not rent their dwelling house without first notifying the Ministry with responsibility for Economic Development, Investment, and Commerce, in order to rent the said property.

(d) The Licensee shall fully comply with the laws of Anguilla in force from time to time including the Land Development Control Act, the Property Tax Act, the Building Regulations, the Labour Relations Act 2018, and Work Permit Regulations 2023, the Social Security Act, the Immigration and Passport Regulations and any statutory modification or re-enactment thereof and any rules or regulations made there under.
