Executive Council was presented with the Medium Term Economic and Fiscal Plan (MTEFP) 2026-2028, its associated Fiscal Framework and the priorities for the 2026 budget. Throughout the extensive presentation on the MTEFP, the following critical points were highlighted:

- Assuming all expenditure occurs as budgeted, the revenue for 2025 includes:
 - i. Capital: EC\$191 million; and
 - ii. Recurrent of EC\$355.44 million.
- The overall balance for 2025 provides for a EC\$ -45.17 million forecasted overall deficit including amortization.
- The revenue outlook for 2025 is set at EC\$526 million. Total revenue is trending upwards for the 2025 to 2028 period.
- The recurrent expenditure outlook for 2025 is set at EC\$355.4 million. Total revenue is projected to grow by approximately 18% from 2025 to 2028.
- The fiscal outlook as it relates to the overall balance anticipates a return to surplus in 2027 and further improvement in 2028.

Executive Council:

- 1. Approved the following policy priorities for the 2026 Budget to be circulated via Budget Call Circular No. 1²:
 - a) Boosting economic growth through progressive labour, immigration and land reforms with a focus on enhancing accessibility, to encourage personal and commercial investment;

- Supporting young people through diverse learning opportunities, improved learning systems, enhanced sports development and investments in the creative industries;
- c) Investing in health systems to expand the provision of specialized healthcare services, inclusive of mental healthcare, to ensure comprehensive, accessible, and quality care;
- d) Ensuring food security by investing in production infrastructure at commercial and community levels to meet the nutritional needs of our communities;
- e) Improving revenue generation through harnessing the potential of domain name registration and other digital opportunities;
- f) Investing in productive infrastructure to support improved public services, inclusive of port development, administration buildings, road networks and water systems to enhance efficiency.
- 2. Approved the Medium- Term Economic and Fiscal Plan and associated fiscal framework 2026-2028; and
- 3. Instructed the Ministry of Finance to provide to the United Kingdom Government, a copy of the Medium-Term Economic and Fiscal Plan 2026-2028 and associated fiscal framework out to 2030 for information.
