QUALIFICATION OF JURORS

Qualification of jurors

4. Every person who has attained the age of 18 but is not more than 60 years of age, not hereinafter disqualified or exempted, who is qualified to be a voter under the Constitution of Anguilla and any law of Anguilla providing for the registration of voters for the election of members to the House of Assembly, whether his or her name appears on the list of such voters or not, shall be qualified and liable to serve as a juror on juries for the trial and determination of proceedings before the Court.

Qualification of special jurors

5. (1) Every person who has attained the age of 18 but is not more than 60 years of age, not hereinafter disqualified or exempted, who is qualified to be a voter under the Constitution of Anguilla and any law of Anguilla providing for the registration of voters for the election of members to the House of Assembly, whether his or her name appears on the list of such voters or not, shall be qualified and liable to serve as a special juror on juries for the trial and determination of proceedings before the Court but there shall be a qualification by income that shall in all cases be not less than \$240 a year inclusive of the value of any board or lodging to which that person is lawfully entitled under the terms of his employment.

(2) Every person liable for the time being to serve as a special juror shall also be liable to serve as a common juror.

Disqualification and exemption from serving as juror

6. The persons described in Part 1 of Schedule 1 are disqualified, and the persons described in Part 2 of that Schedule are exempt, from serving on a jury.

PART 2
JURORS' REGISTER AND SPECIAL JURORS' LIST

Jurors' list

7. Between the 1st and 22nd days of June of every year, the Registrar —
- (a) shall make out, in the form in Schedule 2, a list, for the ensuing calendar year, in alphabetical order, of all persons resident in Anguilla, who, in his opinion, are liable to serve as common jurors, with the first and middle given names and surname, and the prescribed particulars, of each such person set forth, to the best of his knowledge and belief, in the proper columns of the list, and shall also distinguish in the list, in the prescribed manner, such of the persons as are, in his opinion, also liable to serve as special jurors, but the list of common jurors or special jurors shall only be considered completed, before revision by the Magistrate as hereinafter provided, when approval of the list is given in writing by the Attorney General of Anguilla to the Registrar; and
