

Anguilla Government Statistics Department – June 2007 International Merchandise Trade Statistics Summary


OVERVIEW


Imports for the month of June totalled EC\$52.2 million, an 81.2% increase over the corresponding 2006 June import value. This increase was fuelled mainly by Consumption Goods, which accounted for 53.1% of the total imports in June 2007.

There were increases in imports for all the S.I.T.C¹ categories during June 2007. Primary Goods experienced the largest increase of the three categories with 131.3%, which more then doubled its corresponding 2006 figure.

Consumption Goods and Capital Goods showed increases of 89.7% and 34.9% respectively over their corresponding 2006 figure.

Primary and Capital Goods contributed 24.5% and 22.4% respectively to the total import bill for June 2007.






CONSUMPTION GOODS

Consumption Goods accounted for EC\$27.7 million of the total imports, with all the components experiencing increases over their corresponding June 2006 values.

The Manufactured Goods by Material component contributed the largest value and had the largest increase over its 2006 figure. This category contributed a total value of EC\$15.6 million, which accounted for 56.0% of Consumption Goods imports, an increase of 171.5%, which more than doubled its 2006 corresponding figure. This was due in part, to imports of items such as the new vehicle number plates imported by the Government of Anguilla, jewelry imported by jewelry stores, windows, doors, metal structures, tiles and non alloyed pig iron which are currently in demand by construction projects.

Food and Live Animals for the month of June 2007 contributed the second largest value in the Consumption Category, with a total value of EC\$4.5 million, an increase of 36.7% over its corresponding 2006 figure. This import value accounted for 16.4% of Consumption Goods imports.




PRIMARY GOODS

Primary Goods accounted for EC\$12.8 million of the total import value, a 131.3% increase over its corresponding 2006 figure. All components in the Primary Goods category experienced increases over their corresponding June 2006 figure, with Mineral Fuels, Lubricants contributing EC\$6.8 millions, 53.1% of the Primary Goods import value. This figure almost doubled its 2006 figure with a 97.6% increase over the 2006 figure. This was part due, to imports of items such as diesel oil and petroleum jelly,

Chemicals & Related Products contributed EC\$4.7 million, 36.9% of the Primary Goods import value. This figure more than doubled its 2006 figure with an increase of 167.2%. This was part due, to imports of items such as PVP pipes, fittings, mastics and paints.

Crude Material, inedible, Except Fuel contributed EC\$1.3 million to the total Primary Goods import value, which almost quadrupled its 2006 figure with a 291.7% increase, this was part due to imports of items such as sand and pitch pine wood used in construction.



Capital Goods accounted for EC\$11.7 million, 22.4% of the total import bill, with Machinery and Transport Equipment being the sole component in this category, experiencing a 34.9% increase over it corresponding June 2006 figure. This was due in part to imports of items such as vehicles, air conditioning units, portable radios and boats & vessels used for pleasure.



EXPORTS

Exports which include re-exports and domestic exports for the month of June were valued at EC\$2.3 million, a 54.5% increase over its June 2006 value. Domestic exports totaled EC\$1.27 million in June 2007; a 1.1% increase when compared to EC\$1.25 million in June 2006.

Anguilla's balance of trade for June 2007 was in deficit by EC\$49.9 million. This represents a deficit increase of 82.7% when compared with the same period in 2006.
