WEEK 1

September 1

Did you know? A work permit is a legal instrument giving information required for employment of certain people for a specified job, for a specified period of time not exceeding one year.

Persons' requiring work permits have to be classed into the seven Occupation group categories, which are Professional & Technical, Administrative & Managerial, Clerical, Sales, Services, Agricultural and Production and Construction and Transport. The most work permits in 2004, 37%, were issued in the Production and Construction and Transport category.

Did you know? Work permits in Anguilla are issued under the following categories: temporary, new and renewal.

Did you know? Work permits are issued by country of birth of the recipient.

Did you know? Data from the Labour Force Survey of September 1999 indicated that there were 9,215 persons in the labour force aged 15 years and over.

Did you know? The Labour Force Survey done in September 1999 concluded that unemployment was lower and employment higher during the peak tourist season which usually occurs from January to March of each year.

In Anguilla unemployed persons are persons 15 years and over who had no employment but, were available for work, except for temporary illness, and had made specific efforts to find employment sometime within a specified recent period. Persons who were waiting to be recalled to a job from which they had been laid off need not have been looking for work to be classified as unemployed.
